

Note: This document is **not** a replacement for BUSN and GERM plans of study, but rather a supplemental tool to be used alongside official plans of study, the Standard Advisement Report, and UConn Academic Catalog. Students are ultimately responsible for ensuring all degree requirements are met for each of their dual degrees with the School of Business and College of Liberal Arts and Science (CLAS).

SAMPLE SEQUENCE FOR FIRST TWO YEARS

This is intended for students who had not previously taken German language courses. Consult with the GERM department for proper placement in first/second year language courses if you have prior German language experience.
